

# available Funding Prorammes

- **‘Power to change’** – Proposed new £150 million fund endowed by the Big Lottery Fund that will support community-led enterprise across England. Due to open in 2015. <http://www.biglotteryfund.org.uk/powertochange>
- **Heritage Enterprise Fund** – Heritage Enterprise supports enterprising community organisations across the UK to rescue neglected historic buildings and sites and unlock their economic potential. Priority for deprived areas <http://www.hlf.org.uk/looking-funding/our-grant-programmes/heritage-enterprise>
- **Townscape Heritage Fund:** The Townscape Heritage programme helps communities regenerate deprived towns and cities across the UK by improving their built historic environment. Grants range from £100,000 to £2million. Can include areas of public realm. Applies to schemes in Conservation Areas. <http://www-tmp.hlf.org.uk/looking-funding/our-grant-programmes/townscape-heritage>
- **Landscape Partnership Programme** – Landscape Partnership schemes put heritage conservation at the heart of rural and peri-urban regeneration. Local, regional and national organisations work by conserving habitats at a landscape-scale. The scheme focusses on nine key outcomes. <http://www.hlf.org.uk/looking-funding/our-grant-programmes/landscape-partnerships>
- **Big Lottery Fund**– <http://www.biglotteryfund.org.uk/> Focus on communities, welfare and deprivation.
